STATE OF WOMEN IN INDIANA

Women4Change partnered with the Indiana Historical Society for our second annual conference. Attendees learned how to increase their power to create change during an inspiring day of discussion, activities, and action steps with leading ChangeMakers from across the state.



EL TENDEDERO/THE CLOTHESLINE

Artist Mónica Mayer presented her El Tendedero/The Clothesline project, an installation at the Museum of Modern Art in Mexico City, in 1978. W4C is now working with Mayer to expose the rate of sexual assault in Indiana and persuade the IGA to enact legislation defining consent. We kicked off our year-long programming in September with more than 30 arts and advocacy organizations.

UPLIFTING WOMEN

With our partner, Summit Performance Indianapolis, we enjoyed an empowering evening of stories, poems, and livepainting from courageous women of different ages and backgrounds in the community. The event sold out prior to the performance.



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EDUCATE & COLLABORATE

EDUCATE

Indy Gov 101 - Women4Change and Beth White, Executive Director of the Greater Indianapolis Progress Committee, hosted a discussion series on central Indiana's government structure, election process, and local challenges.

Listen, Connect, & Participate - Women4Change Indiana and WomenChangeMakers organized several nonpartisan expert panels on pay equity, human trafficking, and violence against women. Hundreds of community members engaged in important conversations to move Indiana forward. Discussions always included at least one Republican and Democrat representative as well as two subject matter experts.

Civics, Civility, & Consensus - Peer-led workshops opened conversations about civility and consensus to develop a unifying culture.

Other Programs: News We Can Trust, Constitution 101, and Authors and Activists

COLLABORATE

Youth Advocacy Training with Girls Inc of Greater Indianapolis - Women4Change partnered with Girls Inc. to facilitate our new Youth Advocacy Training workshop and Feminism 101 seminar for their Young Women in Leadership group. These young women will make Indiana a better place as they grow into scholars, citizens, and advocates.

Constitution Day - In celebration of Constitution Day, we partnered with the ACLU to give away 1,000 pocket constitutions.

Women Behaving Badly - We joined the Indiana Historical Society to commemorate the women in the shadows of Hoosier history.

INDIANA GENERAL ASSEMBLY PRIORITIES

— 2019 —

HATE CRIMES

- Indiana was one of five states without a hate crimes law. Hoosiers have experienced a 17% rise in hate crimes over the last year nationwide. As a state, we can do more to protect our citizens.
- W4C is a proud member of the Indiana Forward Coalition, working together to pass strong, inclusive hate crime legislation that will send the clearest message that Indiana has no room for hate against any individual.

REDISTRICTING & VOTER ACCESS

- Through the Indiana Coalition for Independent Redistricting, W4C is working to end the gerrymandering present in our
 elections. The current opaque process for establishing districts leads to noncompetitive districts and, consequently, low
 voter turnout.
- Fair districts and expanded voter access will increase Hoosiers' voices in government and create a stronger democracy.

EQUAL PAY

- Indiana ranks 49th out the 50 states and the District of Columbia for the gender pay gap with Hoosier women, on average, making only 74 cents for a man's dollar.
- As a member of the Equality Pay\$ Coalition, W4C is working to secure equal pay for equal work.

OPIOIDS

- Hoosier families and communities tragically suffer the effects of the opioid crisis. 1,809 Hoosiers died from a drug overdose in 2017, 63% being opioid-related.
- Our partnerships with the Overdose Lifeline and Dove Recovery House for Women aid people overcoming addiction, and fight the growing presence of opioids in our communities.

DOMESTIC GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION

At least 52 percent of American women killed with guns are killed by intimate partners or family members. Women are 16
times more likely to be killed with guns in the U.S. than in other developed countries. W4C advocates to keep firearms out of
the hands of domestic abusers and dangerous individuals.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

• W4C is working, through proposed state legislation, to more specifically define sexual harassment, and offer justice for victims. W4C supports proper education and training of state officials around the issue of sexual harassment.

MATERNAL & INFANT MORTALITY

• Indiana is ranked 46th in the nation for maternal mortality rate, with an average of 41.4 women dying per 100,000 births, more than double the national average of 20.7 deaths per 100,000 births. Women in Indiana deserve to have children without fear of mortality, and W4C supports the work to create a safer outcome for mothers and infants.

WOMEN'S HEALTH

• W4C advocates for the health, safety, and reproductive freedom for all Hoosier women. We support women's rights to obtain health care without government interference.

ADVOCATE & ACTIVATE

LEGISLATIVE WINS

- Successfully lobbied for and helped pass Indiana's first ever criminal and civil bills protecting victims of nonconsensual pornography
- W4C was the only women's organization to petition the Indiana state government on behalf of the people for hate crimes.
- W4C also lobbied to pass the precursors of Indiana's first red flag laws for domestic abuser gun ownership.



- Nearly a thousand emails and phone calls were sent to legislators during the 2019 session using our OneClick Politics tool.
- Wrote over one hundred letters to pass a comprehensive hate crimes bill
- Hosted and partnered on press conferences about pay equity, comprehensive hate crimes, and the opioid crisis
- Spoke out at rallies for fair redistricting and women's health

ACTION ADVOCATES

 70 Action Advocates —This inaugural group of citizen activists who remained on-call to attend bill hearings, call and write to legislators, and march at rallies.






